"CRONUS"

The Titan grows in the rain forest, and is becoming more rare due to habitat destruction and illegal collection.

It produces the largest unbranched, inflorescence (structure containing multiple flowers) in the world. The largest of these ever recorded was over 9.5 feet tall.

The inflorescence is made up of the spathe and spadix (contains hundreds of tiny male and female flowers).

The spathe will open about 3 weeks after the bud tip appears, and only lasts 24-48 hours.

A strong odor is released at peak bloom (when spathe open), and will attract pollinators such as carrion beetles, sweat beetles and flesh flies.

After the "bloom" dies, a large leaf (can be 12 feet tall) will appear for about a year. When it dies, the plant is dormant (rests) before the process starts again.
